DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

Credits Required; 40 additional credits – 208

The Doctor of Ministry degree requires 40 credits beyond the completion of the Master of Arts in Missions and Theology. In addition, a mandatory doctoral dissertation is needed. The dissertation can be an original written work of 150 pages or come in the form of the creation of a ministry work. The written work should combine the use of textual research and a practical testing of the thesis in real life. Somehow the ministry work or the original written work should add a new perspective to the knowledge and practice of the topic addressed by the thesis. All courses will be Directed Study courses, under the assigned leadership.

MINISTRY COURSES (MIN)

Although there are many ways in which to share your faith and lead the lost, the instructor will endeavor to instruct the students in a biblical foundation on sharing their faith. This will be based solely on the model which was given by Christ our Savior.

MIN 204 Homiletics, Preaching and Teaching ----- 2 Credits

This course offers practical guidance related to the what, how, and why of expository preaching.

MIN 205 Wholistic Christianity ----- 2 Credits

Textbook: Head, Heart & Hands by Dennis P. Hollinger

MIN 301 Pastoral Ministry and Helps ----- 3 Credits

MIS 201 **World Missions 1** ----- 2 Credits

of other cultures, as well as the ways in which cultures differ.

MIS 211 **World Missions 2** ----- 2 Credits

Textbook: Introducing World Missions by A. Scott Moreau,
Gary R. Corwin, & Gary B. McGee

This course is a biblical and historical foundation for World Missions.
It is a practical analysis of Mission in the Scriptures, Missions in History,
Missions as a Candidate, and finally, Missions in the Contemporary World.

MIS 250 **Missions Practicum** ----- 8 Credits

This is a course that gives the student an opportunity to put into
practice all that they have learned while at Calvary Bible

using lectures, language lab, media, assignments, and practical learning activities.

MIS 301 **Church Planting 1** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: T4T A Discipleship Revolution by Steve Smith with Ying Kai
Using the textbook, T4T: A Discipleship Re-revolution by Steve Smith, the
class will be able to see the long-time Biblical bases church planting methods.
Evaluating how churches are planted today in light of the Word of God is utterly
important if we want the Holy Spirit to be the forerunner in our efforts.
This course will become a manual for making disciples.



MIS 302 **World Religions** ----- 3 Credits

A study of the practices and beliefs of religions around the world with Scriptural grounds for refuting these erroneous doctrines.

MIS 401 **Biblical Theology of Missions** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: Missions in the Age of the Spirit by John V. York
 Pentecostal Missiology grounded in Scripture, conscious of history, and aware of missionary practices.

MIS 402 **History of the Expansion of Christianity** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: How Should We Then Live? By Francis Schaeffer
 An analysis of Western civilization from ancient Rome to the Atomic Age examining philosophy, theology, the arts, and morals from a Biblical perspective.

THEOLOGY COURSES (THE)

THE 101 **Foundations of Faith 1** ----- 2 Credits

Textbook: The Fire Bible
 This class will examine and discuss the foundations of the Christian Faith.

THE 102 **Foundations of Faith 2** ----- 2 Credits

Textbook: The Fire Bible
 Using the Fire Bible, the class will examine and discuss the foundations of the Christian Faith.

THE 103 **The Fear of the Lord** ----- 2 Credits

Textbook: The Fear of the Lord by John Bevere
 This class exposes the number one need in the life of every Christian, the fear of the Lord. Fearing the Lord, as the foundation of truth, relates to all of life.



THE 104 **The Holy Spirit** — — — — — 2 Credits

The purpose of this course is to facilitate an introduction to the Person of the Holy Spirit.

THE 201 **Systematic Theology 1** — — — — — 2 Credits

Textbook: Introducing Christian Doctrine by Millard J. Erickson

This course is a study in systematic theology and its place among the other divisions of theology.

THE 202 **Systematic Theology 2** — — — — — 2 Credits

Textbook: Introducing Christian Doctrine by Millard J. Erickson

This course is a study in systematic theology and its place among the other divisions of theology.

THE 203 **Systematic Theology 3** — — — — — 2 Credits

THE 301 **Current Issues in Theology** ----- 3 Credits

At the center of this study students will investigate three questions: 1) What is the purpose(s) of spiritual gifts?
 2) What is the nature of authority in church leadership?
 3) What are the accountability structures in church leadership?

THE 302 **Christian Worldview** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: How Now Shall We Live? By Charles Colson and Nancy Pearcey
 This course will equip the student to understand and comfort rival ideologies in the world today.

THE 303 **Christian Ethics** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: Christian Ethics by Norman L. Geisler
 This course is a study of ethical concerns such as, war, euthanasia, abortion, marriage and divorce, capital punishment, and others. This class will deal with what is morally right and wrong for a Christian. The Bible will be the authority for conclusions.

THE 306 **Apologetics** ----- 3 Credits

Text: The Truth Project by Focus on the Family
 Learn to look at life from a Biblical perspective. Each lesson discusses in great detail the relevance and importance of living the Christian worldview daily.

THE 399 **Directed Study** ----- 3 Credits

Research project completed on a theological topic chosen by the student and approved by the post-graduate dean.

THE 401 **Hermeneutics** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: The Hermeneutical Spiral by Grant R. Osbourne
 This course provides seminary students with the set of tools they need to advance from sound exegesis to the development of biblical and systematic theologies, to biblical sermons.

THE 402 **Revelation/The Last Days** ----- 3 Credits

Textbook: The Last Days According to Jesus by R.C.Sproul
 Discusses various theories regarding the end-times and Christ's return.



APPLIED SCIENCES DESCRIPTIONS

Landscape Horticulture Technology

This course begins with the fundamentals of gardening, including how to create and care for all types of plants and flowers, then provides a thorough introduction on all aspects and techniques of professional landscaping.

Automotive Technology

Learning to troubleshoot, diagnose, identify parts, repair components, and service vehicles.
